THE IMITATION GAME



Raising children is an incredible blessing. For those that have had the opportunity of either witnessing the miracle of birth or being the birth-giver yourself, you understand how powerful and beautiful it is to bring life into the world. When my wife, Sydney (Mrs. Rodriguez, 4th grade aide), and I brought our daughter, Audrey, into the world in 2022, we could not have fully realized the weight and responsibility of raising a human being, yet we knew we wanted to fully embrace that challenge. We have now come to understand how true the phrase is: "It is not what you say, it is what you do that is the greatest teacher."

Well, there is a term often shared amongst those who raise young children, and that is known as "the terrible twos"- an unpleasant phase in childhood development marked by frequent tantrums and ongoing battles for independence. When our daughter Audrey had graciously blossomed into this era she had also been in a series of tantrums and meltdowns for a period of many days. In one particular instance, I was addressing Audrey because she was not listening to us, and almost immediately she began to display words and characteristics that were not her own. She was aggressively crossing her arms, with a deep scowl in her brow and shouted: "NO, BAD, BAD!" This was shocking to both Sydney and I as we do not use that kind of tone or language with her. We learned later that this was a behavior she picked up from a child at one of the other daycare providers that she often frequents. Children often do not learn as much from what we say, but rather they learn from what we do.



According to psychological studies of infants, "In the second half of the first year a child will imitate the expressive movements of others—for example, raising of the arms, smiling, and attempts at speech. In the second year the child begins imitating other people's reactions to objects." We learn our language, slang, culture, even our first interests from those who raised us. As parents, guardians, teachers, coaches, pastors, and leaders we forget that while what we say is important, it is what we do that is imitated. Paul writes to the Corinthian church in 1st Corinthians chapter eleven verse one: "Imitate me, as I imitate Christ." Raising and influencing children is a wonderful experience, but if we seek to imitate Christ then our children will imitate Him as well. I have obligation to lead with my voice, but I have a responsibility to lead with my actions. The closer I am to Christ, the more I will reflect His Glory, and the more I reflect Him, the more those whom I lead will also imitate Him. Be encouraged to lead like Christ, imitate Him and the ones you lead will also imitate Him.
